






Sugary drinks and diabetes

Increase in incidence of diabetes per 1 serving/day increase in consumption



Attributable risk:

USA: over 10 years, 1.8m of 20.9m (8.7%) expected new cases of diabetes due to SSBs

UK: over 10 years, 79k of 2.6m (3.6%) expected new cases of diabetes due to SSBs

Predicted UK effect of 20% tax on obesity





- Short term impacts up to 2 yrs
 - Commercial data purchases
 - Routine dietary data consumption
 - Routine childhood measurement data health
 - Supermarket data diversification, formulation, price
- Microsimulation of health outcomes over 5-15 yrs
- Economic modelling of impacts on food sector, treasury, and health & social care sectors
- Acceptability to public, politicians & professionals up to 2 yrs
