# FAQs for Applying to the Women's Farmers Academy

### 1. What is the purpose of the Women's Farmers Academy?

The Women's Farmers Academy will provide access to virtual coursework in sustainable agriculture and agri-business development. This will involve training in crop production and management, climate resilience, nutritional marketing, and agri-business development.

### 2. What are the organisations responsible for the Women's Farmers Academy?

The Women's Farmers Academy is a collaboration between "Improving Household Nutrition Security and Public Health in the CARICOM" also known as the Food and Nutrition (FaN) project and Helen's Daughters.

The FaN project is associated with Food4ChangeCaribbean, and its main goal is to improve dietary diversity across the CARICOM region by increasing healthy eating and improving sustainable livelihoods. ### 3. Who can participate in the Women's Farmers Academy?

Persons must meet each of the criteria below to be eligible to participate in the Women's Farmers Academy.

- Be a woman aged 18 years or older.
- Be a national or legal resident of the island of St. Vincent and the Grenadines or St. Kitts and Nevis.
- Be a farmer or woman interested in working in agriculture or agro-processing.
- Be willing to attend at least 80% of the online classes.

### 4. Do I need to have a computer and Internet access to join the Women's Farmers Academy?

Yes, persons enrolled in the Women's Farmers Academy will need computer and Internet access to actively participate in online classroom activities. Online classes will be hosted using the Zoom software programme, showing PowerPoint presentations and other audio and video materials.

## 5. How long is the Women's Farmers Academy?

The Women's Farmers Academy will last anywhere between 6 to 8 weeks. The exact length of time depends on the course modules that will be taught, and students' availability.

### 6. Is the Women's Farmers Academy only offering online training courses at specific times?

Yes, courses will be delivered **online only** by local and experienced facilitators who will receive training from Helen's Daughters in the application of virtual agricultural advisory services (agricultural extension).

### 7. Am I expected to complete assignments?

Students of the Women's Farmers Academy will not be given any in-class or homework assignments, but they will be required to complete pre-and post-evaluation surveys to assess their knowledge and skills before the training begins, and after training ends.

## 8. Will I have any support if I need assistance with course work?

Yes, students will receive mentorship from training facilitators and their student peers.

### 9. What proof will I have of my participation in the Women's Farmers Academy?

A Certificate of Achievement will be awarded to students. To qualify, students must attend 80% of online classes and successfully complete the post-evaluation survey.
